Question Roulette

Teaching Tip Series #2

If you find you are not getting questions from many students, try **Question Roulette**. Everyone writes down a question. Upon your signal, they all pass their questions in one direction, continuing to do so until you say “STOP.” Randomly ask students to ask the question in their hand. This assists students who are reluctant to speak to a full class. An added benefit is that you can provide constructive criticism about how to improve a question because no one knows who asked it.
