**\*\*FOREIGN LANGUAGE WAIVER POLICY:** In order to waive the foreign language requirement, a student must provide documentation indicating qualification based on one of the following criteria: Note: these options reflect policy of Asnuntuck Community College only. Options may differ with other postsecondary institutions. 1. Successful completion of the third level\* or higher of one foreign language in high school.\*If the student has completed only up to the second level, the student can request to take the second level of a foreign language (college SPA 102, SGN 102, etc.) to satisfy the foreign language requirement Requests must be made to the Program Coordinator of Liberal Arts or Liberal Arts/Fine Arts. 2. Passing the CLEP, a standardized examination which demonstrates knowledge of a foreign language equivalent to completion of a second-semester course or higher. 3. Foreign language proficiency in a language other than English can be assessed on an individual basis. If waived, an additional 6-8 Liberal Arts credits must be substituted for the foreign language electives in order to meet graduation requirements toward the degree.

### Program Information

**Transfer Opportunities:** The curriculum is specifically designed to fulfill general education requirements typically required by four-year institutions. **This degree provides a good framework for the maximum transferability of courses.** Students transfer successfully to the Connecticut State Universities and are able to utilize transfer equivalencies and advising resources. The transfer counselor can always be consulted when transferring.

**Employment Information:** The Associate Degree gained from either General Studies or Liberal Arts may lead to advancement of employment as well as an increase in earnings.

**Graduation Information:** A cumulative 2.0 GPA is required to graduate. All courses for degree credit must be numbered 100 or above. Students must complete and submit a Graduation Application to the Registrar's Office in order to graduate. *Graduation Application deadlines:* December graduation - December 1st, May graduation - March 31st, August graduation - August 1st.
